## FEBRUARY MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

- The February meeting was held on February 14, 2019, at the King Family Library in Sevierville. Officers and directors present were: Jim Wharton, Paul Barton, Mike Cravy, Bill Mills and Paul Wellborn.
- Jim Wharton called the meeting to order at 6:27 PM.
- The reading of the January minutes was dispensed and the minutes were approved as submitted.
- Bill Klein reported that we have received 129% of our budgeted income and have spent 33% of our budgeted expenses. The motion to accept the treasurer's report as submitted was approved.
- Mike Cravy reported that we have 392 members who have paid their 2019 dues as of 2/10/2019. We have 57 2018 members who have not yet renewed and have not informed us that the do not intend to renew,
- Samantha Barton reported that we can purchase 40 spots on each of Radio Station 105.5 and Radio Station 106.3 to run during weekday prime time over a 4 week period for \$1099. Also included will be an in studio interview and 20 combo ads. A motion to purchase this advertising package was made, seconded, and approved.
- Samantha Barton reported on activities for both the First Shots Program and on the Ladies Target Tuesday Program.
- Paul Barton has scheduled a Vintage Military Rifle match followed by a rim fire rifle match on February 21, 2019.
- Paul Barton has scheduled the next Handgun Challenge for March 23, 2019.
- Mike Cravy reported that we are waiting on the COI from Sevierville Police Dept.
- Mike Cravy reported that the Boy Scouts Winterfest event, held February 9, 2019, used our existing Porta Potties and used 1250 clay targets. A motion was made, seconded and approved to donate the cost of the targets and the porta potties to the Scout Program.
- Mike Cravy reported that cost of a dumpster on the range will increase significantly this year. Paul Wellborn is to investigate an alternate dumpster source.
- Jim Wharton reported that we have placed a sign at the entrance to the Treebeard property and that the surveyor staked out the site for the new Police Training Range.
